



OPENING TIMES


Open all year round



AT THE HEART OF HISTORY

« With a history spanning more than a thousand years, this great stone edifice, listed as a Historical Monument, takes you on a journey through time. In turn a counts' residence, a castle, a royal prison and a barracks, Lourdes Castle has withstood the ravages of time and countless attacks and is today home to the Musée Pvrénéen.

The fortress, whose defensive architecture has been preserved (keep, drawbridge, portcullis), also offers a view over the town, the Sanctuary and the Pyrenees from

Within its walls is a museum that tells the story of Pyrenean history and culture on both the French and Spanish sides.

Enjoy a moment of relaxation in its botanical garden, where you will find sculptures and architectural models ».

When the castle was under attack. the only source of water for the people and garrison soldiers taking refuge inside was rainwater.

The Guardroom, from where you can access the covered parapet walk.

6 NINEPINS

The region's most popular game, played with 3, 6 or 9 pins.

CHAMBRE DE BIGORRE

A rural bed chamber, complete with trunk and wedding chest.

Tools essential for mountain farming. plus original items relating to life as a shepherd in the summer pastures.



MOURNING CANDLES

Candles lit to mourn the dead, from funerary tradition to popular belief.

COSTUMES

Festival clothing is more than just a costume, it is part of the very identity of the Pyrenean valleys.

III FURNITURE

Cabinets featuring intricate decorative patterns, typical of the Béarn and Basque Country.

WEAVER

All about the loom and how wool and flax are woven into fabrics.

SAMADET FAIENCE

A fine collection of 18th century tin-glazed earthenware.

Tinkling transhumance bells and voke-balancers accompanied the herds on the move.

SALLE D'HONNEUR DU PYRÉNÉISME


Temporary exhibitions.
